

The IAEA mission arrived at the Zaporizhzhia Nuclear Power Station on September 1, 2022, for an inspection and then left on the same day, leaving five of its employees behind. The mission members confirmed in their report that Russia had deployed "military personnel, vehicles, and equipment at various locations at the Zaporizhzhia NPP, particularly several military heavy trucks on the first floor of the turbine halls in power units 1 and 2." The presence of the Rosatom expert group was recorded, which could interfere with normal operational management tasks and cause friction in the decision-making process. The IAEA recommends that any shelling of the station cease immediately to avoid further damage, which requires "the consent of all relevant parties." At the same time, it is not specified who performs the shelling.

On September 1, 2022, Presidential Decree No. 621/2022 was signed 09.01.2022, canceling six presidential decrees concerning Ukraine's representatives in the Tripartite Contact Group, effectively ending the so-called "Minsk negotiation process," which was actually terminated due to Russia's full-scale invasion.

On September 1, 2022 the NBU published the state of Ukraine's international reserves which according to preliminary data amounted to 25,436.0 million dollars. USA. They increased by 13.6% in August, thanks to the arrival of a significant amount of international aid against the backdrop of the country's moderate foreign debt payments and smaller National Bank interventions on the sale of foreign currency.

On September 2, 2022, the Russian gas company "Gazprom" announced in the evening the complete stoppage of gas pumping through the "Northern Stream" pipeline due to a malfunction in the only "Portova" compressor station, which continues to operate. Earlier, "Gazprom" stopped supplies to Europe through the Nord Stream pipeline for three days, starting on Wednesday. Expectations are growing in Europe that these shipments will be used as a way to pressure the EU through sanctions.

On September 2, 2022, Law No. 2519-IX "On Amendments to the Law of Ukraine "On Volunteering" Regarding Support of Volunteer Activities" and Law of Ukraine No. 2520-IX "On Amendments to the Tax Code of Ukraine Regarding Promotion of the Development of Volunteer Activities and Non-Profit Activities" were signed. Institutions and organizations in the context of the Russian Federation's armed aggression against Ukraine." Law No. 2519-IX defines additional areas of volunteer activity, particularly those aimed at mitigating the consequences of the Russian Federation's military aggression in Ukraine. The document also calls for the development of targeted programs to provide state support for volunteer activities.

Law No. 2520-IX provides for the following changes:

- the expenses of non-profit organizations for medical examination, vaccination of a volunteer and other medical and preventive measures directly related to the provision of volunteer assistance are not taxed in accordance with the Law of Ukraine "On Volunteering";

- the expenses of a non-profit organization or institution for a volunteer's business trip are not taxed (for travel, payment of accommodation costs, food expenses, payment for telephone calls, issuance of foreign passports, entry permits, mandatory insurance, other documented expenses);
- compensatory expenses related to participation are not taxable volunteers in training events.

On September 6, 2022, the Ministry of Defense signed an order that once again postponed the terms of taking women professions/specialties for military registration for another year - until October 1, 2023. The "ANTS" analytical department, along with other analytical centers, issued a statement regarding the need to amend current legislation regarding voluntary military registration for women.

On September 6, 2022, Spiegel published a study estimating russia's income from the sale of energy carriers during the war to be the equivalent of 158 billion euros. The EU was the largest buyer, paying 85 billion euros, followed by China, which paid 35 billion euros.
