GERMANY WILL ADD MORE THAN €54 BILLION IN HELP TO THE ENERGY SUPPORT FUND OF UKRAINE

The funds will be provided within the framework of the expansion of the German-Ukrainian energy partnership for the procurement of energy equipment needed to restore and repair Ukrainian energy facilities.

Germany has already donated the largest to the Energy Support Fund of Ukraine - €129,5 billion. An additional €20 million was also provided under the German-Ukrainian Partnership to finance the procurement and supply of technical equipment.

IN UKRAINE, 411 MEDICAL FACILITIES DAMAGED AS A RESULT OF THE FULL-SCALE INVASION OF RUSSIAN TROOPS HAVE BEEN FULLY RESTORED, AND ANOTHER 412 FACILITIES HAVE BEEN PARTIALLY RESTORED.

According to the Ministry of Health, as of today, Russian invaders have damaged a total of 1,455 medical facilities in Ukraine and destroyed another 190.

Medical facilities in Kharkiv, Donetsk, Mykolaiv, Kyiv, and Chernihiv regions have suffered the greatest losses.

THE EUROPEAN INVESTMENT BANK (EIB) WILL FUND TWO RECOVERY PROJECTS IN UKRAINE

The first two instalments of €100 million each, out of €450 million, may be approved by the end of 2023.

The funds will be used for two projects:

- Ukraine Recovery III FL (€250 million, first instalment €100 million), aimed at financing critical social and municipal infrastructure.
- Ukraine Water Recovery FL (€200 million, first instalment €100 million) to restore
 water supply and sewerage, including measures to overcome the consequences of the
 destruction of the Kakhovka dam.

THE UKRAINIAN GOVERNMENT HAS APPROVED AN AGREEMENT THAT WILL ATTRACT ANOTHER €250 MILLION FROM THE EU FOR RAPID RECOVERY

The funds will be used to rebuild bridges, railways, schools, kindergartens, hospitals, and residential buildings, and to support Ukrainian farmers.

According to the Government, the Energy Support Fund for Ukraine, together with the announced contributions, has already exceeded €300 million.

Among the leaders of support are the EU, Germany, Sweden, the US, and the UK. Ukraine uses the Energy Support Fund to purchase transformers, turbines, equipment for trunk power grids, etc.

GERMANY WILL PROVIDE UKRAINE WITH €700 THOUSAND TO RESTORE THE INTERNET AFTER DE-OCCUPATION

Additional funds have been allocated under the ReACT4UA/EU4Business international cooperation programme.

70 Ukrainian telecoms companies operating in Kyiv, Chernihiv, Sumy, Kharkiv, Donetsk, Kherson, Zaporizhzhia, Mykolaiv and Luhansk regions will receive up to €10,000 to restore the Internet in the de-occupied territories.

THE STEERING COMMITTEE OF THE MYKOLAIV-MYKOLAIV REGION-DENMARK PARTNERSHIP APPROVED A NEW \$42.9 MILLION AID PACKAGE FOR UKRAINE

The package includes, among other things, the purchase and installation of equipment for heat supply, water supply, district heating, and support for the reconstruction of critical social infrastructure and civilian institutions in the region.

Denmark has taken a leading role in rebuilding Mykolaiv. The cooperation is focused on eight areas: infrastructure, good governance, maritime, transport, urban planning, small and medium-sized business development, green transition, youth and culture.

CZECH REPUBLIC AND TAIWAN SIGN AGREEMENT TO REBUILD UKRAINE

The agreement between Taiwan and the Czech Republic, signed by the ambassadors of both countries, provides for joint work on the restoration of water and energy systems.

Ukraine has gained sympathy in Taiwan after the full-scale invasion of Russia. Many Taiwanese see parallels between the situation in Ukraine and the threat that the Taipei government says China poses to it, as it considers the island its territory.

Taiwan has donated more than \$100 million in humanitarian aid to Ukraine and has joined the Western-led sanctions against Russia.

UKRAINE WILL RECEIVE €100 MILLION TO IMPLEMENT PROJECTS TO RESTORE HEALTHCARE INFRASTRUCTURE

The Council of Europe's Development Bank has approved a €100 million loan to Ukraine to rebuild the healthcare system and meet urgent healthcare needs.

The loan will be used to support the Healthcare Enhancement and Life Saving (HEAL Ukraine) project developed by the World Bank in cooperation with the Ukrainian authorities.

SWEDEN ALLOCATES OVER €6.5 MILLION TO REBUILD UKRAINIAN SCHOOLS AND KINDERGARTENS

The Swedish authorities have announced the allocation of SEK 75 million (approximately €6.52 million) to the UNESCO Foundation to restore and rebuild destroyed schools and kindergartens in Ukraine and provide them with shelters.

UKRAINE MAY RECEIVE ALMOST €162 MILLION FROM THE EUROPEAN INVESTMENT BANK

Prime Minister of Ukraine Denys Denys said that within the framework of the current reconstruction programmes in Ukraine, the funds will be used to reconstruct and build schools, hospitals, kindergartens, administrative buildings, ASCs, sewage treatment plants, and other facilities.

In total, thanks to the EIB funding, Ukraine will be able to complete 28 projects this year and start implementing 186 new recovery projects.

JAPAN PLANS TO PROVIDE €160 MILLION TO SUPPORT UKRAINE'S ECONOMIC RECOVERY PROJECTS

On 20 November, Prime Minister Denys Shmyhal met in Kyiv with Japanese Foreign Minister Kiyoto Tsuji, Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry Kazuchika Iwata, and representatives of Japanese business.

The ministers assured that Japan's position on supporting Ukraine would remain unchanged.

The Government of Japan will also help Ukraine with humanitarian demining and the restoration of the agricultural sector. It is planned to set up a working group to develop a strategy for restoring Ukrainian agriculture.
